Notice is hereby given that the first Annual General Meeting of the members of Talga Gold Limited ("Talga" or the "Company") will be held at First Floor, 2 Richardson Street, West Perth WA 6005 on 30 November 2011 at 11.00am (WST).

The Explanatory Statement that accompanies and forms part of this Notice of Meeting describes in more detail the matters to be considered.

### **AGENDA**

### ORDINARY BUSINESS

1. To receive and consider the financial report of the Company together with the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report for the year ended 30 June 2011 as set out in the Annual Report.

### 2. Adoption of Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of Section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, the Company adopts the Remuneration Report."

Short Explanation: The Corporations Act provides that a Resolution that the remuneration report to be adopted must be put to vote at a listed company's annual general meeting. The vote on Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

### **Voting exclusion:**

The Company will disregard any vote cast on Resolution 1 by, or on behalf of:

- (a) a member of the key management personnel as disclosed in the Remuneration Report (Key Management Personnel);
   and
- (b) a closely related party (such as close family members and any controlled companies) of those persons, unless the vote is cast by a person as a proxy for a person entitled to vote in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form.

The Chairman of the meeting intends to vote all available proxies (directed and undirected) in favour of Resolution 1.

### 3. To re-elect Mr Sean Neary as a Director

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, Mr Sean Neary, being a Director, retires in accordance with the Constitution and, being eligible for election, is hereby elected as a Director."

## 4. Issue of Director Options to Sean Neary

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass as an ordinary resolution:

"That, for the purposes of Section 208 of the Corporations Act, ASX Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, approval is given to allot and issue 750,000 Director Options to Sean Neary (or his nominee) on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

**Voting Exclusion:** The Company will disregard any votes cast on this Resolution by Sean Neary (or his nominee) and any of his associates unless:

- (a) it is cast by a person as a proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with the directions on the Proxy Form; or
- (b) it is cast by the person chairing the meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form to vote as the proxy decides.

A person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if:

- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

"That, for the purposes of Section 208 of the Corporations Act, ASX Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, approval is given for the Directors to allot and issue 2,000,000 Director Options to Mark Thompson (or his nominee) on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

**Voting Exclusion**: The Company will disregard any votes cast on this Resolution by Mark Thompson (or his nominee) and any of his associates unless:

- (a) it is cast by a person as a proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with the directions on the Proxy Form; or
- (b) it is cast by the person chairing the meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form to vote as the proxy decides.

A person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if:

- (a) the proxy is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such a member; and
- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

**Voting Exclusion**: The Company will disregard any votes cast on this Resolution by Piers Lewis (or his nominee) and any of his associates unless:

- (a) it is cast by a person as a proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with the directions on the Proxy Form; or
- (b) it is cast by the person chairing the meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form to vote as the proxy decides.

A person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if:

- (a) the proxy is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such a member; and
- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

### **PROXIES**

- 1. A member entitled to attend and vote at a meeting of the Company is entitled to appoint not more than two proxies to attend and vote instead of the member. If two proxies are appointed, and a member does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes each proxy may exercise, each proxy may exercise half the votes. A proxy need not be a member of the Company.
- 2. In order to vote on behalf of a company that is a shareholder of Talga, a valid Power of Attorney in the name of the attendee, must be either lodged with the Company prior to the Meeting, or be presented at the Meeting before registering on the attendance register for the Meeting.
- 3. Forms to appoint proxies, and the Power of Attorney (if any) under which they are signed, must be lodged at the registered office of the Company, at First Floor, 2 Richardson Street, West Perth Western Australia 6005, or by facsimile (61 8) 9322 1935 not less than 48 hours before the time of the Meeting, being 11:00am (WST) on 28 November 2011 or resumption of an adjourned meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote.
- 4. An instrument appointing a proxy:
  - a) shall be in writing under the hand of the appointor or of his attorney, or if the appointor is a corporation, either under seal or under the hand of a duly authorised officer or attorney;
  - b) may specify the manner in which the proxy is to vote in respect of a particular Resolution and, where an instrument of proxy so provides, the proxy is not entitled to vote on the Resolution except as specified in the instrument;
  - c) shall be deemed to confer authority to demand or join in demanding a poll;
  - d) shall be in such form as the Directors determine and which complies with Section 250A of the Corporations Act 2001;
  - e) proxies appointing the Chairman which do not specify the way in which the proxy is to vote on a particular Resolution will be recorded as voting in favour of the Resolutions.

### ATTENDANCE AND VOTING ELIGIBILITY

For the purpose of regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001, the Directors have determined that Shares held at 4.00pm WST on 28 November 2011 will be taken, for the purposes of this Annual General Meeting, to be held by the persons who held them at that time.

#### INTRODUCTION

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared for the information of Shareholders of Talga Gold Limited ("Talga" or the "Company") in connection with Resolutions 1 to 5 of the Annual General Meeting of members to be held at First floor, 2 Richardson Street, West Perth, Western Australia 6005, at 11.00am, 30 November 2011.

This Explanatory Statement should be read in conjunction with the accompanying Notice of Meeting. Please refer to Section 5 of this Explanatory Statement for a glossary of terms. You should read this Explanatory Statement in full before making any decision in relation to the Resolutions. Capitalised terms in this Explanatory Statement are defined in Section 5 of the Explanatory Statement. You should consult your professional advisers if you have any questions in relation to how to vote on the Resolutions.

### 1. ACCOUNTS AND REPORTS

As required under Section 317 of the Corporations Act, the annual financial report (which includes the Director's Report (including the remuneration report) and the Auditor's Report) for the year ended 30 June 2011 will be laid before the annual general meeting of the Company.

Shareholders will be given the opportunity to ask questions and make comments about the reports or the Company generally, but there will be no formal resolution submitted to the meeting. The Company's auditor will also be present at the meeting and Shareholders will be given the opportunity to ask the auditor questions about the conduct of the audit, the preparation and content of the auditor's report, the accounting policies adopted by the Company and the independence of the auditor.

### 2. RESOLUTION 1 – REMUNERATION REPORT

In accordance with Section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put a Resolution that the Remuneration Report be adopted to vote at the Annual General Meeting. The vote on Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company. However, the Board will take the outcome of the vote into consideration when reviewing the remuneration practices and policies of the Company.

The Remuneration Report includes all of the information required by Section 300A of the Corporations Act, including:

- board policy for determining, or in relation to, the nature and amount (or value, as appropriate) of remuneration of directors, secretaries and senior managers of the Company;
- discussion of the relationship between such policy and the Company's performance;
- the prescribed details in relation to the remuneration of each Director and certain executives; and
- any performance conditions applicable to the remuneration of executive Directors and senior management of the Company.

A reasonable opportunity will be provided for discussion of the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting.

If you choose to appoint a proxy, you are encouraged to direct your proxy how to vote on Resolution 1 by marking either "For", "Against" or "Abstain" on the Proxy Form. The Chairman of the Meeting intends to vote all available proxies (directed and undirected) in favour of resolution 1.

The Board of Directors unanimously recommends that Shareholders vote to approve Resolution 1.

### 3. RESOLUTION 2: TO RE-ELECT MR SEAN NEARY AS A DIRECTOR

Resolution 2 seeks approval for the re-election of Mr Sean Neary, who retires in accordance with Clause 12.17 of the Company's Constitution and, being eligible, offers himself for election as a Director of the Company, with effect from the end of the meeting.

Mr Neary is a Certified Practicing Accountant with more than 20 years experience in finance and commercial advisory roles. His experience includes more than ten years in audit and tax consulting with 'Big Four' and second tier accounting practices in Australia, and commercial experience including six years in a finance role with US based chemical giant, Dow Corning. In addition to his exceptional leadership qualities, Mr Neary brings to the Talga Gold board a wealth of financial industry and corporate strategy experience that will ensure the company's sustainable growth towards gold production.

The Board of Directors, other than Mr Neary, unanimously recommends that Shareholders vote to approve Resolution 2.

# 4. RESOLUTIONS 3 TO 5 – ISSUE OF DIRECTOR OPTIONS TO SEAN NEARY, MARK THOMPSON AND PIERS LEWIS

### 4.1 GENERAL

The Company has agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to allot and issue a total of 3,500,000 Options with an exercise price of \$0.35 each and expiring on 30 November 2014 (**Director Options**) to Messrs Sean Neary, Mark Thompson and Piers Lewis (**Related Parties**) on the terms and conditions set out below.

Under Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act, for a public company to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval.

The grant of the Directors Options constitutes giving a financial benefit and Messrs Sean Neary, Mark Thompson and Piers Lewis are related parties of the Company by virtue of being Directors.

In addition, ASX Listing Rule 10.11 also requires shareholder approval to be obtained where an entity issues, or agrees to issue, securities to a related party. Approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is not required in order to issue the Director Options to the Related Parties as approval is being obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of Director Options to the Related Parties will not be included in the 15% calculation of the Company's annual placement capacity pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Accordingly, Shareholder approval is sought under Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act and ASX Listing Rule 10.11 for the grant of Director Options to the Related Parties.

### 4.2 Shareholder Approval (Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act and ASX Listing Rule 10.11)

The following information is provided in relation to the proposed grant of Director Options in accordance with the requirements of Section 219 of the Corporations Act::

(a) The related parties are Messrs Sean Neary, Mark Thompson and Piers Lewis and they are related parties by virtue of being Directors.

- (b) The maximum number of Director Options (being the nature of the financial benefit being provided) to be granted to the Related Parties is 3,500,000 Director Options with:
  - (i) 750,000 Director Options to be granted to Sean Neary;
  - (ii) 2,000,000 Director Options to be granted to Mark Thompson; and
  - (iii) 750,000 Director Options to be granted to Piers Lewis.
- (c) The Director Options will be granted for nil cash consideration, accordingly no funds will be raised.
- (d) The terms and conditions of the Director Options are set out in Schedule 1.
- (e) The value of the Director Options and the pricing methodology is set out in Schedule 2.
- (f) The relevant interests of the Related Parties in securities of the Company are set out below:

(g) The remuneration and emoluments from the Company to the Related Parties for the previous financial year and the proposed remuneration and emoluments for the current financial year are set out below:

(h) If the Director Options granted to the Related Parties are exercised, a total of 3,500,000 Shares would be allotted and issued. This will increase the number of Shares on issue from 46,351,907 to 49,851,907 (assuming that no other Options are exercised and no other Shares are issued) with the effect that the shareholding of existing Shareholders would be diluted by an aggregate of 7.02%, comprising 1.50% by Sean Neary, 4.01% by Mark Thompson, and 1.50% by Piers Lewis.

The market price for Shares during the term of the Director Options would normally determine whether or not the Director Options are exercised. If, at any time any of the Director Options are exercised and the Shares are trading on ASX at a price that is higher than the exercise price of the Director Options, there may be a perceived cost to the Company.

- (j) The primary purpose of the grant of the Director Options to the Related Parties is to provide a performance linked incentive component in the remuneration package for the Related Parties to motivate and reward the performance of the Related Parties in their respective roles as Directors.
- (k) Sean Neary declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders in relation to Resolution 3 due to his material personal interest in the outcome of the Resolution. However, in respect of Resolutions 4 and 5, he recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of those Resolutions for the following reasons:
  - (i) the grant of Director Options to the other Related Parties will align the interests of the Related Parties with those of Shareholders;
  - (ii) the grant of the Director Options is a reasonable and appropriate method to provide cost effective remuneration as the non-cash form of this benefit will allow the Company to spend a greater proportion of its cash reserves on its operations than it would if alternative cash forms of remuneration were given to the Related Parties; and
  - (iii) it is not considered that there are any significant opportunity costs to the Company or benefits foregone by the Company in granting the Director Options upon the terms proposed.
- (1) Mark Thompson declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders in relation to Resolution 4 due to his material personal interest in the outcome of the Resolution. However, in respect of Resolutions 3 and 5 recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of those Resolutions for the reasons set out in subparagraphs 1.1(k)(i) to (ii).
- (m) Piers Lewis declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders in relation to Resolution 5 due to his material personal interest in the outcome of the Resolution. However, in respect of Resolutions 3 and 4 recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of those Resolutions for the reasons set out in subparagraphs 1.1(k)(i) to (ii).
- (n) In forming their recommendations, each Director considered the experience of each other Related Party, the current market price of Shares, the current market practices when determining the number of Director Options to be granted as well as the exercise price and expiry date of those Director Options and the Board is not aware of any other information that would be reasonably required by Shareholders to allow them to make a decision whether it is in the best interests of the Company to pass Resolutions 3 to 5. The Chairman of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolutions 3 to 5.

For the purposes of Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided to Shareholders:

- (a) The Director Options will be granted to Messrs Sean Neary, Mark Thompson and Piers Lewis, the Directors of the Company.
- (b) The maximum number of Director Options to be granted is 3,500,000, being:

- (iv) 750,000 Director Options to Sean Neary;
- (v) 2,000,000 Director Options to Mark Thompson; and
- (vi) 750,000 Director Options to Piers Lewis.
- (c) The Director Options will be issued to the Related Parties no later than 1 month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date as permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the ASX Listing Rules) and it is anticipated all the Director Options will be issued on one date.
- (d) The Director Options will be issued for nil cash consideration.
- (e) No funds will be raised by the issuing of the Director Options. A total of \$1,225,000 would be raised if the Director Options were exercised by the Related Parties in full. The proceeds would be used to fund the Company's gold projects and working capital.
- (f) The terms and conditions of the Options are set out in Schedule 1.

Shareholders should read this Explanatory Statement carefully before deciding how to vote on each Resolution.

Attached to the Notice of Meeting is a proxy form for use by Shareholders. Lodgement of a proxy form will not preclude a shareholder from attending and voting at the Meeting in person.

The Director Options entitle the holder to subscribe for Shares on the following terms and conditions:

- (a) Each Director Option gives the optionholder (**Optionholder**) the right to subscribe for one Share.
- (b) Each Director Option will expire at 5.00pm (WST) on 30 November 2014 (**Expiry Date**). A Director Option not exercised before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse on the Expiry Date.
- (c) Subject to paragraph (l), the amount payable upon exercise of each Director Option will be \$0.35 (Exercise Price).
- (d) The Optionholder must remain an employee or consultant of Talga Gold Limited for the Director Options to be eligible for exercise. They will automatically lapse within 28 days of the Optionholder leaving the Company unless the Board determines otherwise which will only happen in extenuating circumstances.
- (e) The Director Options held by each Optionholder may be exercised in whole or in part, and if exercised in part, multiples of 1,000 must be exercised on each occasion.
- (f) An Optionholder may exercise their Director Options by lodging with the Company, before the Expiry Date:
  - (i) a written notice of exercise of Director Options specifying the number of Director Options being exercised; and
  - (ii) a cheque or electronic funds transfer for the Exercise Price for the number of Director Options being exercised; (Exercise Notice).
- (g) An Exercise Notice is only effective when the Company has received the full amount of the Exercise Price in cleared funds.
- (h) Within 10 Business Days of receipt of the Exercise Notice accompanied by the Exercise Price, the Company will allot the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Director Options specified in the Exercise Notice.
- (i) The Director Options are not transferable except with the prior written consent of the Board of Director.
- (j) All Shares allotted upon the exercise of Director Options will upon allotment rank pari passu in all respects with other Shares.
- (k) The Company will not apply for quotation of the Director Options on ASX. However, the Company will apply for quotation of all Shares allotted pursuant to the exercise of Director Options on ASX within 10 Business Days after the date of allotment of those Shares.
- (l) If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of an Optionholder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.
- (m) There are no participating rights or entitlements inherent in the Director Options and Optionholders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Director Options. However, the Company will ensure that for the purposes of determining entitlements to any such issue, the record date will be at least 6 Business Days after the issue is announced. This will give Optionholders the opportunity to exercise their Director Options prior to the date for determining entitlements to participate in any such issue.
- (n) An Director Option does not confer the right to a change in Exercise Price or a change in the number of underlying securities over which the Director Option can be exercised.
